FIRST READING

From the letter of the apostle Paul to the Romans 12:1-21; 13:8-10

Though we are many we are one body in Christ

I urge you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourself to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I tell everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than one ought to think, but to think soberly, each according to the measure of faith that God has apportioned. For as in one body we have many parts, and all the parts do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ and individually parts of one another. Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us exercise them: if prophecy, in proportion to the faith; if ministry, in ministering; if one is a teacher, in teaching; if one exhorts, in exhortation; if one contributes, in generosity; if one is over others, with diligence; if one does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

Let love be sincere; hate what is evil, hold on to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; anticipate one another in showing honour. Do not grow slack in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the holy ones, exercise hospitality. Bless those who persecute [you], bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Have the same regard for one another; do not be haughty but associate with the lowly; do not be wise in your own estimation. Do not repay anyone evil for evil; be concerned for what is noble in the sight of all. If possible, on your part, live at peace with all. Beloved, do not look for revenge but leave room for the wrath; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." Rather, " if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals upon his head." Do not be conquered by evil but conquer evil with good.

Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; you shall not kill; you shall

not steal; you shall not covet," and whatever other commandment there may be, are summed up in this saying, [namely] "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." Love does no evil to the neighbour; hence, love is the fulfilment of the law.

From the Legenda de Origine of the Order of Servants of Mary (N.1-2; *Monumenta O.S.M.*, I, p. 60-61)

Let us conform ourselves to the teaching and lives of our Fathers

Our purpose here is to extol a group of godly men who, 'second only to the Lord, deserve to be called our spiritual fathers. It was they who begot us, in the Order, by the holiness of their word and example. It was they, who, like fathers, watched over us and saw to it that we had spiritual food for our nourishment; they took in hand our upbringing in knowledge, art and science, pointing out to us the best and surest way to attain a holy life. This they did in the Order by offering themselves to God, every thought, word and deed, in humility of heart. They chose the path of truth and lived according to its laws without wavering.

Willingly dedicating their whole lives to the Lord, they made our Order in their own day pleasing to God and the Blessed Virgin Mary. Even more, through their prayers they won this favour: that the Order would continue after them and into the future, God willing, and would count saintly religious among its members.

The Lord and the Blessed Virgin Mary were pleased by the fives of these godly men who began our Order and graciously accepted the service they so wholeheartedly gave. We are able to prove this, first of all, by the fact that even while they were alive the Lord enhanced their lives with many wonders and miracles. When they were dying, signs and other prodigies showed that their souls were very dear to him. And afterwards he proved beyond doubt that these fathers of ours were with him in eternal glory by working through their merits yet more signs and wonders.

If we can keep before our eyes the word and example with which these fathers of ours spiritually begot us; if we can learn about how they lived and made themselves and the Order pleasing to the Lord, then we win find ourselves speaking and acting like they did and everyone will be able to see that they have left behind children who resemble them. It will be obvious that we have taken their example, doing everything in humility of heart; that we too have chosen the path of truth, living according to its law without wavering; and that we, like them, have willingly dedicated our lives to the Lord and made the Order and ourselves in our own day pleasing to God and Our Lady. By our constant prayers we will assure that the Order will continue after us too. just as they gave us an example to live by, we too have to leave an example for those who come after us in the Order, urging them to do the same for their successors and so on from one generation to the next.

If we and those who come after us can do this, great good win come to the Order. It will be a source of tremendous joy to Our Lady; she will be wonderfully consoled in us, her servants, and we will be honouring her with our service, showing the world that she is worthy of every reverence. The Lord himself will be moved to endow our Order with constant spiritual gifts and graces, evidence of how pleased he is with it.

There is yet another point to be made. When people come from the world to our Order, as to one of the six biblical cities of refuge, and find in it without fail religious who are life-giving in what they say and do, they will be attracted to the Order by the gentleness of the example and instruction. They will never want to go away, either in body or in spirit, from this city of refuge until the end of their lives when their souls, now dead to the world and sin, will be called by Christ the High Priest to unending life and be restored to complete liberty.

To serve the Lord and their brothers and sisters the Servants draw constant inspiration from Mary, servant of the Lord

The Order of Friar Servants of Mary, founded as an expression of evangelical apostolic life, is a community of men gathered together in the name of Jesus the Lord. Moved by the Spirit, we commit ourselves, as did our first Fathers, to witness the gospel in fraternal communion and to be at the service of God and all his children, drawing constant inspiration from Mary, Mother and Servant of the Lord.

This commitment, rooted in baptismal consecration and expressed in religious profession, is voluntarily undertaken by us in order to fulfil the commandment of love. It implies constant conformity with Christ who came to serve and to give his life for all, and to reveal that we are children of the same Father and brothers and sisters to one another.

In keeping with the practice of the Apostolic Church and the Rule of Saint Augustine, our communities live with one heart and one mind in prayer, listening to the Word of God, breaking together the Eucharistic Bread and the bread earned by our work while eagerly awaiting the Lord who is coming. As brothers united in love and supported by our regard for one another, we put in common our goods, hopes and works and we make our decisions collegially.

Following the mendicant ideal of our Order, we live itinerancy as an acceptance of the gospel value of insecurity in a passing world and as a willingness to go wherever our service calls us. In order to serve the Lord and their brothers and sisters, the Servants from their origins have dedicated themselves to the Mother of God, the Blessed One of the Most High.

They have turned to her on their pilgrimage to Christ and in their task of proclaiming Him to the world. From the *fiat* of the lowly servant of the Lord, they have learned to receive the Word of God and to be attentive to the promptings of the Spirit. From the Mother sharing in the redemptive mission of the Son, the Suffering Servant of the Lord, they have learned to understand and alleviate human suffering.

The Servants have honoured Saint Mary as their Lady with particular acts of reverence: greeting her with the angelic salutation at the beginning of their community gatherings; offering the traditional homage of her Vigil; dedicating their churches to her; celebrating her feasts with solemnity and calling her to mind in 'a special way on Saturday and at the close of each day. Faithful to our vocation of service, we seek to understand the significance of the Virgin Mary for the modern world. Brothers to everyone, we journey together toward a deeper union in love.

Sensitive to the needs of the Church, we seek to know more about Mary, God's Mother and ours, and her mission in the mystery of salvation. Seeing in her the "most excellent fruit of redemption," we energetically support individuals and society itself in their struggle to be free. Aware of division among Christians we do everything in our power to make the Daughter of Zion a symbol of unity for all. To an insecure world, we propose as a model of the confidence befitting God's children the humble woman who placed all her hope in her Lord.

Our communities are to witness to the human and gospel values which Mary enshrines and the devotion which the Church renders her. They shall express their devotion to Mary by drawing on practices from our living tradition or by creating others as a manifestation of renewed service to the Virgin.
