Entrance Antiphon

Exult you just in the Lord; praise from the upright is fitting. Give thanks to the Lord on the harp, with the ten stringed lyre chant his praises.

Your people shall all be just, they shall always possess the land, they, the bud of my planting, my handiwork to show my glory.

Prayer of the Assembly

Almighty God, graciously sustain in us the same spirit of service that you so generously gave to the holy men and women of the Order of Servants of Mary. (We ask this) through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

First Reading 1 Corinthians. 12, 4-13

A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians There are different workings but the same God Brothers and sisters,

there are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit;

there are different forms of service

but the same Lord:

here are different workings

but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit

is given for some benefit.

To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom;

to another the expression of knowledge

according to the same Spirit;

to another faith by the same Spirit;

to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit;

to another mighty deeds; to another prophecy;

to another discernment of spirits; to another varieties of tongues;

to another interpretation of tongues.

But one and the same Spirit produces all of these,

distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

As a body is one though it has many parts,

and all the parts of the body,

though many, are one body, so also Christ.

or Alternative First Reading Revelation 7, 13-17

A Reading from the Book of Revelation

They stand before God's throne and worship him day and night

Then one of the elders spoke up and said to me, "Who are these wearing white robes, and where did they come from?" I said to him, "My lord, you are the one who knows." He said to me, "These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they stand before God's throne and worship him day and night in his temple. The one who sits on the throne will shelter them. They will not hunger or thirst anymore, nor will the sun or any heat strike them. For the Lamb who is in the centre of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."
